#### Veterinary Medicine Tuition Approach

Tailored to the needs of the individual but tuition can include:

- Lectures on University choice and requirements, college choice (for Cambridge), the interview process at the different universities
- Personal statement tuition by adjusting and talking through drafts. I always aim to ensure this is 100% the students work, guiding them to make their statement the best it can be rather than writing it for them.
- Mock interviews with appropriate veterinary based questions, including a discussion afterwards in a de-brief, touching on any changes the student could have made.
- Lectures on current topics of veterinary interest, stretching the students' knowledge around the career.
